

# **CLASS DESCRIPTIONS**

### 1. STATIC SHOCKERS: FUN WITH STATIC ELECTRICITY (GRADES K-2)

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

# 1. Are classes right after one another?

Yes. There are 3 sessions in the morning with 15 minutes in between the classes for switching.

### 2. Do I have to attend all 3 sessions?

All classes start and end at the same time and almost all students stay for all 3 classes. But

each year, there are some who have to skip the first session and some who have to leave after 2 sessions.

# 3. Do parents stay?

The program is designed so that the parents don't need to stay. However, you can take the free parent class or just wait in the foyer area, we'll have chairs setup.

# 4. Who can participate?

This is for all elementary school kids (grades K through 6), including those who are not from North Penn School District.

# 5. Who is helping young students get to one place and the next?

All students line up in the gym based on their assigned classes. Middle school and high school volunteer students bring them to the classroom, bring them back to the gym, and help them line up for the next class in the gym. We also have many parent volunteers. So, many classes will also have an adult to escort the students to their classes.
